As part of her clinical work, she provides outpatient psychotherapy to those impacted by childhood sexual abuse, emotional and physical maltreatment and other traumatic events. Sueann is internationally recognized in the field and is an author, guest lecturer and clinician who has trained thousands of professionals.

S-1: Parents Are Clients Too: Hows and Whens of Filial Play Therapy - Kathryn Raley, NCC, LPC, ACS, RPT (Intermediate, 6 Credit Hours)

Filial Play Therapy is a wonderful application for helping our parents help themselves and their children. This presentation offers participants a look at how to structure classical filial play therapy as well as some innovated strategies and interventions designed to support families in treatment. Format includes lecture, discussion and experiential learning.

Morning Session Choices: S-2 S-3 S-4

S-2: Emotions from the Inside Out - Erin Bennetts, LCSW, RPT (Beginning, 3 Credit Hours)

Riley, Joy, Anger, Sadness, Fear, and Disgust invite you to approach emotions from the Inside Out. Explore the practical application of brain - based directive and non-directive play therapy interventions to facilitate the identification of emotional states, widen the window of tolerance, and develop emotional regulation skills.

S-3: Addiction and Recovery through a Child's Eyes - Kathleen Rhodes, MA, LPCC and co-presenter Lindsey Chadwick, MA, LPC RPT (Intermediate, 3 Credit Hours)

In homes where substance use is an issue, children are often the first hurt and last helped. Participants will come to understand the unique challenges these children face, and will learn specific skills and strategies that inspire hope and resilience and help them cope within the addicted family system.

S-4: Play Therapy Supervision: Embracing and Managing Challenges of the Profession - Amy Williams Long, PhD, LPC, RPT-S (Advanced, 3 Credit Hours)

With changing trends in clinical supervision and play therapy, Registered Play Therapist Supervisors are facing new and unique professional challenges. The presenter will highlight these challenges (e.g., technology, demand for RPT/S supervision, gatekeeping responsibility), lead dynamic discussions, and introduce ways to address each challenges based on current literature and research.

S-5: Board Game Play Therapy: Finding the Therapeutic Value in Everyday Board Games - Jessica Stone, Ph.D., RPT-S (Beginning, 3 Credit Hours)

Board games have been an important and sometimes controversial tool for use in play therapy. This presentation will focus on the concepts of speaking the client's language, an organized approach to choosing board games, and experiential exercises to practice the application of the BGPT approach.

S-6: Synergetic Play Therapy Goes to School: A Neurobiological Approach to Working with Teachers - Judith Norman, MS, LPC, RPT-S (Beginning/ Intermediate /Advanced, 3 Credit Hours)

Come and learn how to apply the tenets of Synergetic Play Therapy in schools. In this workshop we will explore our role in empowering teachers to make shifts in perception. You will walk away with easy-to-use handouts and concepts that will support you in building meaningful partnerships with teachers and schools.

S-7: Revealing the Life of Adoption in Play Therapy - Kelly Miller, LCSW, RPT-S (Advanced, 3 Credit Hours)

This workshop dives into understanding and conceptualizing the presenting symptoms for adopted children engaged in play therapy. We will explore trauma and attachment for adoptees and their caregivers. Participants will discover how to utilize non-directive and directive interventions throughout the play therapy process unique to the adoption population.
