So Long, Farewell, Auf Wiedersehen:

Exploring Termination in Play Therapy

As therapists, we so often focus our efforts on what happens in the beginning and middle parts of therapy, but what about the end? It is crucial to terminate therapy in a meaningful and deliberate manner, particularly when working with children. This workshop will explore ways that we can approach termination in a variety of circumstances—from the most ideal "graduation" for clients who have met all their treatment goals, to the more frustrating and abrupt end of therapy due to issues outside of our control. This workshop will examine the unique challenges to consider when terminating with clients who have a history of trauma. We will also equip participants with a number of play-based activities that they can use with children and families during the termination process.

Workshop Objectives:

- 1. Identify four different play based activities to address termination.
- 2. Determine ways to recognize when a client or family is ready for play therapy to end.
- 3. Explore solutions to common problems related to termination in play therapy.
- 4. Examine ways to deal with termination when it occurs but is not clinically indicated.
- 5. Recognize specific challenges of termination in relation to children with trauma.
- 6. Explore possible issues of countertransference for play therapists related to termination.


